We have people in school who are specially trained to help you, it is important that you know where to get help if you are worried or unhappy about something:-

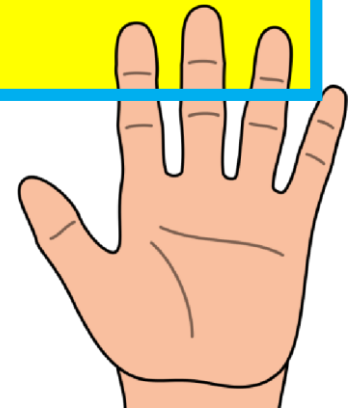
### All staff will:

Is someone trying to give you something you know you shouldn't have?

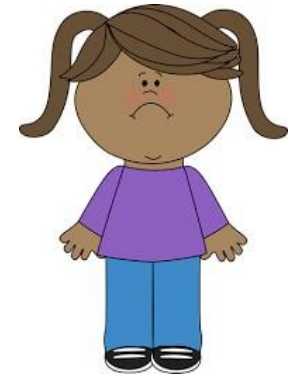


**WE WILL ALWAYS LISTEN!**

**Stay Safe**  
Don't give out your personal information to people / places you don't know.

**Don't Meet Up**  
Meeting someone you have only been in touch with online can be dangerous. Always check with an adult you trust.

**Accepting Files**  
Accepting emails, files, pictures or texts from people you don't know can cause problems.

**Reliable?**  
Check information before you believe it. Is the person or website telling the truth?

**Tell Someone**  
Tell an adult if someone or something makes you feel worried or uncomfortable.
